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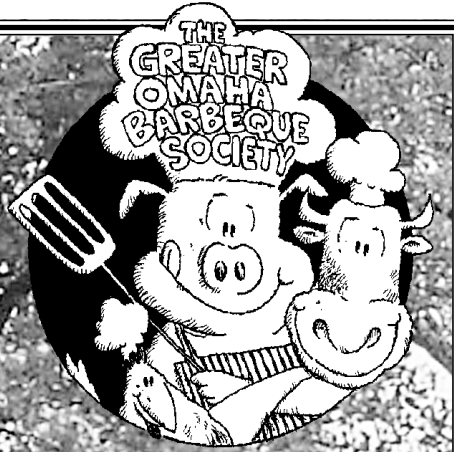

Everyone got their food and found places in the shade, except for the kids. The kids were playing in the lake, and my grandson Tanner Ashford slipped off with

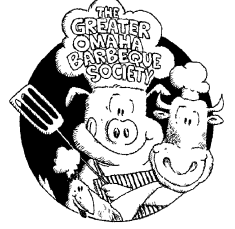
his rod and reel to see if there really were fish in the lake.

This is the atmosphere we have been looking for the past few years...one that blends a laid-back rural setting with the mouth watering smells of go-o-o-od barbeque cooking.

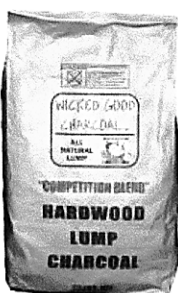
So come on down and get ready to smoke up a storm, 'cause we're fixin' to have a great State Barbeque Championship and lots of fun!!

Barbequed Country Ribs

Ingredients:

- 3.5 to 4 lbs. country-style ribs
- 1 (10.5 oz) can tomato soup
- 1/2 cup cider vinegar
- 1/2 cup brown sugar
- 1T. soy sauce
- 1T. celery seed
- 1 tsp. chili powder

Directions:

Trim excess fat from ribs. Place ribs in slow cooking pot. In mixing bowl, combine tomato soup, vinegar, brown sugar, soy sauce, celery seed, and chili powder. Cover and cook on low setting for 7 to 8 hours, or on high for 5 minutes. Makes 4 servings.
